AKPS are in the top 10% of all schools nationally! We are delighted to announce that we are in the top 10% of all schools nationally for our progress data KS2 2017. We were in the top 10% for reading and Maths last year but now are up there for all 3 areas which is excellent. I have reported that we are well above national for our attainment but progress measures the distance the children have travelled from their starting points, thus showing the progress they have made at our school. This is excellent news to share and I hope you feel proud of your school, we certainly do! Well done to the whole of Team AK, thank you to my passionate and dedicated staff team and our excellent pupils who are real ambassadors for learning!
