

for Tuesday 2nd May

Write a book review of The Witches by Roald Dahl

- * Include why you liked or didn't like it and some of the highlights. Explain who your favourite character was and why
- ** Include character profiles telling the reader a bit about the main characters. Explain who you think the book will appeal to most and why.
- *** Include a brief synopsis of the plot to give the reader an idea of what the story is about.

for Tuesday 9th May

Write your own short adventure story involving a journey or running away.

- * Include language to add interest such as adjectives, verbs and similes. Add illustrations.
- ** Make sure you use paragraphs and add language to add interest including adjectives, powerful verbs, adverbs and similes. Share the character's feelings using show not tell. Add illustrations.
- *** Include chapters with chapter titles to interest the reader. Use paragraphs and add illustrations. Design a book cover and include a front cover and blurb, describing the plot, on the back.

for Tuesday 16th May

Produce a piece of art work inspired by trees. It could be that you draw the tree as you picture it in the Noah Barleywater story, or that you draw / paint a picture of a beautiful tree covered in blossom

- * Add colour (watercolour / pencil / paint)
- $\star\star$ Include some information about why you chose this particular tree
- *** Include a poem, in a style of your choice, about the tree or trees to accompany your art work.

for Tuesday 23rd May

In preparation for World Awareness Week, produce a travel guide for a country you have visited or would like to visit.

- * Include a map of the world showing the location. Include information on the climate, population, language and flag.
- ** As I* suggesting interesting landmarks or places to visit. Consider the use of text boxes and subheadings and use of suitable pictures.
- *** Include a persuasive paragraph of text to tempt the reader to visit this country. Use superlatives like we used when writing adverts.
