Writing Targets


These targets are expectations for the end of Year 1 and can be used to help you support your child with their home learning.

Weekly Tasks

Week 1: 6th September

2* - Add a label to your picture that tells us what it is you'd like to do.

3* - Write a sentence that tells us about what it is you would like to do.

WOW - Tell a grown up about why you would like to do this, and ask them to write it down for you.



Week 2: 13th September

<u>**Task:</u>** In maths we have been learning to represent numbers in different ways. Using counters, fingers, numerals, words, number lines etc.</u>

Choose a number between 1 and 9

1* - and find 3 ways of representing that number.

 2^{\star} - and find 4 ways of representing that number.

3* - and find 5 or more ways of representing that number.

WOW - Give us a fact about your number.



Week 3: 20th September

<u>Task:</u> We have been listening to and learning some poetry.

1* - Perform a poem or nursery rhyme that you already know to your family.

2* - Perform a known poem or nursery rhyme to your family. Think about speaking clearly, loud-ly and with expression.

3* - Learn a new poem of nursery rhyme to perform to your family.

WOW - Make / use some props to add interest to your performance.



Week 4: 27th September

<u>**Task:</u>** Many poems rhyme. How good are you at finding rhyming words?</u>

1* - Write a list of as many words as you can that rhyme with the word **cat**.

2* - Write a list of as many words as you can that rhyme with the word **mash**.

3* - Write a list of as many words as you can that rhyme with the word **make**.

WOW - Have you spotted any patterns in the words you have listed? What do you think it is that makes words rhyme?
