WOW - Make and enjoy some pancakes. With a little help of course!




Week 2: 1st March

<u>Task:</u> We have been writing diary entries as The Lonely Beast. We have had to write in the past tense, and use time connectives to order the events.


- 1* Write a sentence for each of three parts of your day . You can choose any day you like. Try to begin your sentences with ordering words like first, then and next.
