Week 6: Set 12/07/17 Due 18/07/17

<u>Task:</u>. Write your own short story based on the African Savannah. Think about what animals you might find in the Savannah and what the weather / setting would be like. An example of a story could be the adventures of the African Lion– writing a story based on the animals within the Savannah– what adventures do they get up to? What other animals might they come across?

Remember to use the correct punctuation– capital letters and full stops as well as some adjectives to describe the animals/setting in your story.

WOW– Illustrate your story with a picture or a piece of art work.



Children are still expected to <u>read at home, practice times</u> <u>tables and spellings.</u>

Tasks in this booklet will be set on Wednesday each week and should be handed in the following Tuesday.

We are looking for <u>creative ideas</u> and <u>excellent presenta-</u> <u>tion</u> as well as the children enjoying the activities.
