Please bring your child's reading folder to school every day, as books will continue to be changed on a rolling timetable rather than on specific days. Sound fans should be kept in book bags too in order that new sounds can be added.

Please ensure you let us know your child has read by initialling or commenting in their reading record book. We will also continue to hear your child read either individually or in a group and will comment accordingly.

### General Reminders...

Please ensure your child's belongings and clothing are named clearly.

Please make sure your child has a water bottle **containing water only** in school every day and that it is clearly labelled. These are to be kept on the shelf above your child's name. Your child will have free access to these all day.

Please provide a spare pair of underwear for your child just in case...

Your child will still have the opportunity to spend time outside, so a pair of named wellies and a waterproof coat are essential.
