

Dear children, parents and carers,

Welcome back! We hope you have had a lovely summer holiday and had lots of fun!

This term our topic is linked to water and rivers. We have some exciting DT challenges planned linked to boats! Mrs Smith will teach on a Friday. She will teach grammar and punctuation in English and in the afternoon she will teach Science.

Below is information about homework, reading and spelling. Please do pop in and see us if you have any questions about Class 3.

Home Learning

You will receive a new Home Learning brochure with tasks linked to our topic until half term. Homework tasks for both topic and Maths will be set on **Thursdays**. Please hand in homework by **Tuesday** to allow time for me to mark and return it. Please completed Maths homework using a pencil not in pen as it looks so much neater.

Spellings

Spelling tests will be on **Fridays**. Children will be tested on 10 spellings based on a Y3 spelling rule and 5 statutory words, which are words they are expected to learn for their year group. Please can your child make sure they have their spelling book in school on Friday so they can complete the test in their book and then stick in new spellings. This way you are able to keep track of how they are performing in spelling tests. I have attached details about Y3 spelling rules to this newsletter for your reference.

Reading

Your child has received a new reading record. Please can daily reading be recorded. This doesn't have to be recorded by a parent, your child can make entries themselves. If your child is a free reader they are welcome to read books from our class bookshelf, their own books from home or books from the local or school library. Reading books should be in school daily. Your child will have the opportunity to change their reading book once a week during their independent reading slot in guided reading and also once a week during their class library slot during lunch break.

Banded readers. We are keen for every child to become a free reader. For those children reading banded books, Ms Tromans will change these as often as required, ideally daily. Please record an entry in the reading record to show the book has been completed. Without this she is unable to change the book.

Times Tables

Children are encouraged to make use of Times Tables Rock Stars to practise their time tables. In addition I will set a weekly times tables test called **Cracking Times Tables**. This is a 3 minute test which will take place on Thursday and increases in complexity as your child progresses. By the end of Y3 children should know the 4, 8 & 3 times tables in addition to the 2, 10 & 5 times tables learnt in KS1. Below is the Cracking Times Tables pyramid for your reference.

Y3 Spelling Rules

Please note: Spellings may not be set in this order but these rules will be covered during the year.

- Use the prefixes un-, dis-, mis-, re-, pre-.
- Add suffixes beginning with vowel letters to words of more than one syllable e.g. forgetting, preferred, gardening, limited.
- Use the suffix -ly.
- Spell words with endings sounding like 'zh' and 'ch' e.g. *treasure, measure, picture, nature*.
- Spell words with endings which sound like 'zhun' e.g. *division, decision*.
- Spell the homophones brake/break, fair/fare, grate/great, groan/grown, here/hear, heel/heal/he'll, mail/male, main/mane, meet/meat, peace/piece, plain/plane.
- Spell words containing the 'i' sound spelt 'y' elsewhere than at the end of word e.g. *myth, gym*.
- Spell words containing the 'u' sound spelt 'ou' e.g. *young, touch, double*.
- Spell words with the 'k' sound spelt 'ch' e.g. *scheme, school, echo*.
- Spell words with the 'sh' sound spelt 'ch' e.g. *chef, machine*.
- Spell words with the 'ay' sound spelt 'ei', 'eigh' or 'ey' e.g. *eight, they*.
- Use the first two or three letters of a word to check its spelling in a dictionary.
