## Malvern Spring Show Garden Update

I know I have told you via parentmail and in Heores and Heroines but I am super proud of our school as being one of 3 out of 11 schools who achieved GOLD at the Malvern show. Since the show, I have received some beautiful messages from the wider community who visited our garden and were so impressed by the work the children had done and by how well the children spoke about the project. TEAM AK certainly shone brightly in Malvern and across the country! I am so thankful to everyone involved, it was a massive team effort led by our Forest School leader Mr Jackson. I have included just one example, but I have received a few from people all over the country:

Dear Ms Saville,

I visited the RHS Malvern Show at the weekend and wanted to take a few moments to write to you about two of the pupils that I met from Ashton Keynes Primary School, as they manned your School Show Garden.

It was at about 10:30am on Saturday (am hoping that detail will help you identify them), and I met two boys from your school, who came over to me and asked if I'd like to know more about their garden (I think from your leaflet that one might have been Freddie, and although I didn't catch a name, the other boy had dark hair). It was an absolute privilege to chat at length with both of them about the work they had done on their garden; they were very engaging and their enthusiasm and pride in their garden shone through. I especially enjoyed seeing how proud they were of their weaving of the willow fence, and the detail on how the poppies were made. They were also quick to point out how all of the classes had been involved - it was lovely to see them being able to share the credit, and make sure everyone got a mention. They had so clearly enjoyed the whole project and its inclusivity and were keen to draw my attention to all aspects of the garden.

As a topic, it is so very important our children understand WW1 and WW2, and having read in your leaflet that you have many forces children in your school, understanding and appreciating the sacrifices made by families must be even more important. The boys were very knowledgeable, and it was clear that this was very much the pupils' project.

So, a big thank you to your pupils; I felt very strongly that you, the children and their parents, should be <u>especially</u> proud!

## Awareness of the World Week 3<sup>rd</sup> -7<sup>th</sup> June 2019 (First week after half term)

We are putting a twist on our annual World Awareness Week by stepping it up a level this year. We have focussed on many different countries across the world over the past 4 years and have thoroughly enjoyed learning about different countries and cultures. This year the children will still travel around the school working with every teacher and teaching assistant, but the focus will be on global issues such as: recycling, education for all, bee conservation, plastic pollution to name a few. We are doing this as an introduction to our first area of school improvement for next academic year which will focus on Global Advocacy. Our week will start with a launch assembly on sustainability led by one of our parents, who is Mum of Anna (Y5) and Toby (Y3) and Max (joining us in Class R September).

We would like our children to learn how they can be advocates of change and be aware of what is happening in the world around us. This will be in focus for the whole year with us reaching for a Global Advocacy award on the way. The staff team are really excited about this and see

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the Awareness of the World Week as a great way to start. Each area will be phrased as a guestion for enguiry and will be explored in the sessions during the week. Learning will continue in the following week with the older children writing to respond to the questions from the week using evidence they have learned and all classes having the chance to respond at their level. One example is that Class R pupils will work with Mrs Winson (parent of Ben and Jess) to design and make their own wax re-useable sandwich wrap (to replace cling film) and then during Sports' week, they will work with Mrs Tim to make a healthy rainbow sandwich/ wrap and bring it home in their handmade wax wraps and these can be re-used in future lunches! FOAKS always fund a cooking project in World Awareness week so this will be used to fund the making of the wax wraps and the food rainbow wraps which each child makes to bring home during Sports week.

Through conversation, we already have a few parents on board with this idea and if Global Advocacy is something you are passionate about, do let me know and we will look forward to getting you involved next year to help us drive this wonderful project forward. As part of our new build we will be looking at sustainability so this will also link in well.

#### Sports Week 2019

Mr Tanner and I are planning another action packed Sports' week for your children commencing 24<sup>th</sup> June 2019 and ending with Sports Morning for parents/carers to join us with on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June. Children will need to wear PE/Sports kit (not football strips please) all week, make sure their drinks bottle is in school to be re-filled and bring sun hat and wear sun cream. I will let you know more detail nearer the time but we are aiming for a good range of sports and activities to allow your children to be really active all week in a diverse range of physical activities; to try to promote local clubs for children to attend and to inspire children to want to try new sports and activities. The planning stage is really exciting, more when the final plan is in place.
