For Tuesday 25th June

Class 3 learnt about ways we can help the declining bee population. Design a poster to display in school advising people on ways they can help bees in their own gardens.

- 1* Draw pictures and label ways we can help. Make it colourful and eye-catching.
- 2* List at least four ways we can help bees. Include pictures and text boxes with suitable information.
- 3* Come up with a catchy poster title. Think about use of suitable font size, style and colour. Make use of text boxes and pictures and lay it out in an eye-catching way.

For Tuesday 2nd July

Choose a global issue that is important to you and write a letter to a local MP, local council, supermarket or other person / people to persuade them to act now and help. Think about: reducing packaging in shops, reducing the cost of recycling for schools, finding alternative materials for plastics in supermarkets, large supermarkets reducing their palm oil products, using more local and sustainable products in shops etc... Send your letter off but provide a copy we can read.

For Tuesday 9th July

Class 4 focussed on Plastic Pollution. Following our visit on Tuesday to the Fresh Air Sculpture Show, take inspiration from the sculptures you saw and make your own piece of art by recycling plastic! To help, watch the video about an international artist who specialises in making sculptures from plastic bottles.
