We are looking for <u>creative ideas</u> and <u>excellent presentation</u> as well as the children enjoying the activities.


Writing Targets

Tomorrow Thursday 7th March is World Book Day. The whole school theme this year is Roald Dahl .

- 1* Draw and label a picture of the Roald Dahl character you are going to dress as.
- 2* Write a character description for your chosen character. Tell us about their personality as well as their appearance. Maybe you could add an interesting fact or two.
- 3* Rather than telling us who your character is, write a list of clues that will eventually lead us to guess who they are. Start off with clues that could be one of several characters, and then become more specific. WOW Name as many Roald Dahl book titles as you can.

Task 3 - The Seasons

Shirley Hughes book , Out and About, is a poetry book. It is split into four parts; one for each season.

- 1^* List the four seasons in order, and write a sentence about something that takes place in each of the seasons.
- 2* Make a list of 5 events that take place in each season. List them with the dates, in the correct order. They don't have to be events that everyone celebrates; it could be a family birthday.
- 3* Think about Summer and Winter. Plan a birthday party for each of the two seasons. How would they differ? Why would that be?
