We have just submitted evidence for Level 4 now as we have met the criteria with our work in weekly forest school so I look forward to us receiving that next level certificate shortly. Car Parking Solution Part 1

Our new build will not increase the capacity of the school but improve the current facilities but we are totally aware of the problem with parking in Gosditch in particular. So, we've come up with an initial plan (part 1). In terms of solving the parking issue completely, we would ideally need a local field/ piece of land in the village to be donated to our school to use as safe parking but currently this has not presented itself- you never know!

In the meantime, we need to try and do something. Therefore we are asking for help from local residents to help provide safe parking for our staff members who currently cannot fit in our car park and therefore have to park in the road outside school. Whilst they park totally legally, when parents arrive at pick up and drop off it is incredibly conjested out there and therefore can be unsafe for people walking and cause problems with the school bus passing by. In addition sometimes parking is so tight it is difficult for local residents to fully use their drives and we are very keen to avoid any problems/frustrations for them. This will also go into the village newsletter. Here it is:

"Can you help? Do you have a spare parking space near your home, in easy walking distance of the school?

The school is looking for people to offer free parking spaces to staff within school hours so they don't need to park on Gosditch in the road. This will be especially important with the upcoming school building works project, when the road will have to be kept clear.

If you can help, we will identify one member of staff who will park with you regularly on certain specified days within specified hours. We'll then put them in touch with you. If you're usually at work all day or you have spare parking spaces, this may work for you!
