

# **Class 3 Newsletter**

#### Dear children, parents and carers,

Welcome back! We hope you have had a lovely summer holiday and had lots of fun!

This term we are starting with the theme Everyone's Welcome; we will be exploring this in detail in the first weeks back. Later in the term, we will kick off our Stone Age topic with a trip to the Ashmolean Museum on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> September. Mrs Voss will be working in Class 3 on Wednesday and Thursday mornings and on Friday when she will teach grammar and punctuation in English and in the afternoon she will teach Science and PHSE / French (alternating).

We would like to invite you to pop in after school on **Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> September at 3.30pm** for an opportunity to meet us both and ask any questions you might have. #### **Home Learning**

You will receive a new Home Learning brochure with tasks linked to our topic until half term. Homework tasks for both topic and Maths will be set on **Thursdays**. Please hand in homework by **Tuesday** to allow time for us to mark and return it. Please complete Maths homework using a pencil and not in pen as it looks so much neater.

#### **Spellings**

Spelling rules that we are learning in school will be sent home each week, containing information on the spelling rule, possible websites to use to help learn the rule and a list of words that fit the rule. In order to thoroughly learn and embed the spelling rules, there will be no weekly spelling test consisting of 10 words. We want children to be able to apply the rule beyond 10 words which fit the pattern. At the end of each half term the children will have a test which will cover all the spelling rules taught. These scores will be shared with parents.

Please continue to set aside time to help your child learn the spelling rules so that they can confidently apply them to their written work. Little and often is best!

Y3 spelling rules are attached to this newsletter for your reference. Also attached are details of the Y3/Y4 Statutory Spelling list, which are words pupils are expected to be able to spell by the end of Year 4.

## **Reading**

Your child has received a new reading record to note daily reading. This doesn't have to be recorded by a parent, your child can make entries themselves. If your child is a free reader they are welcome to read books from our class bookshelf, their own books from home or books from the local or school library. Reading books should be in school daily. Your child will have the opportunity to change their reading book during their independent reading slot in guided reading and also during their class library slot during lunch break.

We are keen for every child to become a free reader. For those children reading banded books, Ms Harrold will change these when an entry in the reading record shows the book has been completed.

## **Times Tables**

Children are encouraged to make use of Times Tables Rock Stars to practise their time tables. **Cracking Times Tables** will continue. The test will be on Mondays and will continue to be 3 minutes. By the end of Y3 children should know the 4, 8 & 3 times tables in addition to the 2, 10 & 5 times tables learnt in KS1. Below is the Cracking Times Tables pyramid for your reference.

# **Topic Overview**

## PE

# Y3 Spelling Rules

Please note: Spellings may not be set in this order but these rules will be covered during the year. In addition, some rules from KS1 are revisited such as verbs ending in *ing* 

- Use the prefixes un-, dis-, mis-, re-, pre-.
- Add suffixes beginning with vowel letters to words of more than one syllable e.g. forgetting, preferred, gardening, limited.
- Use the suffix -ly.
- Spell words with endings sounding like 'zh' and 'ch' *e.g. treasure, measure, picture, nature.*
- Spell words with endings which sound like 'zhun' *e.g. division, decision.*
- Spell the homophones brake/break, fair/fare, grate/great, groan/grown, here/hear, heel/heal/he'll, mail/male, main/mane, meet/meat, peace/piece, plain/plane.
- Spell words containing the 'i' sound spelt 'y' elsewhere than at the end of word *e.g. myth, gym.*
- Spell words containing the 'u' sound spelt 'ou' *e.g. young, touch, double.*
- Spell words with the 'k' sound spelt 'ch' *e.g. scheme, school, echo.*
- Spell words with the 'sh' sound spelt 'ch' *e.g. chef, machine.*
- Spell words with the 'ay' sound spelt 'ei', 'eigh' or 'ey' *e.g. eight, they.*
- Use the first two or three letters of a word to check its spelling in a dictionary.
