

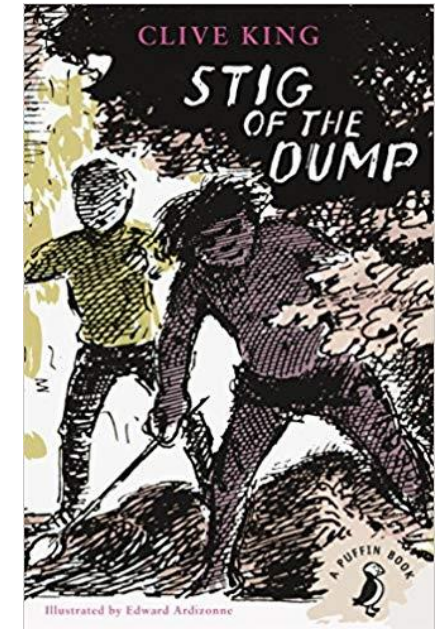

For Tuesday 3rd December

For Tuesday 10th December

For Tuesday 17th December
