We have a wonderful window display in the Coventry Building Society in Cirencester, the build is coming along very nicely, the children are working their socks off in class and I have seen two fantastic class assemblies to parents from Classes 5 and 4, both conveying important messages from our Global advocacy learning. The feedback on these assemblies was so positive regarding the quality of the children's learning and understanding and the brilliant level of performance. I am super proud of the class assemblies to parents and they have come a very long way from when we first started them 5 years ago!

I am ever so thankful to our whole school family for their patience, positive attitude and support with our building project, the site is so different at the moment and everyone is having to be so flexible and patient and I am so grateful for this. It is a super exciting time for us and actually the constricted space, different entrances, blocked off areas all give us a real test of one of our core Christian values, perserverance. We keep going even when it is a challenge and the added wellies in the mix and brilliant behaviour and attitudes of our children during this period of change is just awesome. What a team!

TEAM AK is one of the Sunday Times TOP 250 schools!

I wanted to let you know that Ashton Keynes Primary School is one of the Sunday Times top 250 State Primary Schools! We are ranked at joint 212 which, when you consider there are 16,769 state primary schools in England (https://www.besa.org.uk/key-uk-education-statistics/), puts us in the top 1.5% of all English primary schools!

Last year we were awarded the Pride of the Cotswolds School of the Year 2018 which we were incredibly proud of and for the past two years we have been in the top 3% of all schools nationally. We have so many other awards alongside this and are so proud of them all.

We are having a whole school photograph and will appear in the Wilts and Glos standard soon as we the only school in this area to get into the top 250!

I am so incredibly proud of our school and we are delighted to be in the top 250 schools nationally. This outstanding achievement is real testament to the hard work of our staff and pupils. We are delighted with our children's achievements every year and believe that the unique seven-year journey which we provide for children in our school; the rich, exciting and engaging curriculum along with the warm and caring happy school ethos ensure that all of our children learn and achieve so well. Our children leave this school having made the best progress possible, had the most enriching and engaging school experience and are empowered learners who are more than ready to make a difference in the next stage of their educational journey. 
Year 4 have been hot on the heels of this and wanted to share with you...

This week, the builders have poured loads of cement into the

foundations of the building. If you look carefully, you can see the string separating the different rooms, classrooms and hallways of our new school building. When it is finished, it will be one big building joined to our main school so we will all be together and won't have to go outside to visit the different classrooms. There are lots of teams working together to make our new building, including people drilling into the ground to help each other create the foundations. It is so exciting to see it all coming together.

Since this report, foundations have gone down to form the floor which will soon be concreted! It is super exciting!

Awesome, Amazing, Exciting Building News!

We have been given news that Phase 2 of the building will now go ahead alongside Phase 1! This means that we are able to go ahead and build a Learning Hub at the centre of our school and this is truly awesome! This whole build is a one off chance for our school and therefore if we can make the most of it by building the school we want and need, then we must try to do this. Learning space is so precious and with Phase 2 going ahead we can now create more space for our children. We are not increasing the pupil numbers by doing this, just improving the facilities and creating more space for our exisiting children to learn.



Wiltshire Council funding is to build the three classrooms (EYFS, Y1, Y2 with outdoor learning space, Y1/2 toilets and hygiene room. Beyond the LA funding, the school has already committed to providing necessary additional extras within the build: specific toilets for Class R off their classroom, a music space, smaller partitioned rooms for quiet group work/

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1:1 sessions including ELSA(Emotional Literacy), Speech and Laguage, an extended staff room by knocking through to the other room and links through the building to ensure all parts are linked with secure doors throughout (essential).

The Fundraising team, with your help will focus on raising funds for the Phase 2 Learning Hub. This is just fantastic as it can now be built at the same time as Phase 1. This space will be at the heart of the school and will provide the school with: invaluable space for learning, a new library/reading space, break-out areas for small group learning, multiple class learning area so that classes can work together at times, specialist teaching zone, music and relaxation space, lunchtime clubs, choir, After School Club, IT facilities and so much more! This space will make a huge difference to all children. But we need to raise a total of £110k in the next 18 months to make this happen. We are confident that this target can be reached and we've already made a great start to fundraising, but are seeking the help of every family in the school to achieve the target in a wide variety of ways including, helping at events, reaching out to businesses, giving ideas, donating materials, donating and helping out in any way possible. The staff team are all committed and working hard on this too. We totally understand that we have a big fundraising effort to achieve but we are all so focussed and already onto this. We are reaching out to local and national businesses, organising events and much much more. We have an incredible fundraising team of parents and Governors who have a strategy in place and will share this in the near future. FOAKS already work super hard each year to provide our school with incredibly valuable resources such as our Wiltshire library interactive learning resources for every class and enabling children to take part in the life education van, rock stars maths and travel to the pantomime but beyond this, they raise money for legacy projects such as the Smooga. The legacy project from this point forward is the Learning hub and therefore this means we are focussing our fundraising efforts together for the same aim. For now, please enjoy watching the build progress and with the addition of Phase 2, know it will make a massive difference to all of our pupils now and in the future. If you have any thoughts or would like to get more involved then please let us know! Together we will do this- one united family!

Thank you as always for your continued support and partnership, this school is one incredibly special place to be.


