

## Class 3 Newsletter Spring Term 2020

Dear Children, Parents and Carers,

Welcome back! We hope you have had a fantastic Christmas holiday and enjoyed the time spent with your family and friends. Thank you all for your lovely cards and gifts, it was very kind of you to think of us.

We welcome Mrs Cleaver to the Year 3 team, who will share the teaching with Mrs Voss whilst Miss Redman is recovering from her operation. Mrs Cleaver will be in class all day on Mondays and Tuesdays, as well as Wednesday mornings. Mrs Voss will be in class all day on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays until Miss Redman returns.

This term start a new geography based topic, "How do we get from Point A to Point B?" Our English lessons will focus on the Ted Hughes story The Iron Man. The children will produce work linked to the story and write in a variety of styles including poetry and newspaper reports. Mrs Cleaver and Mrs Voss will be splitting the Maths units, so the children will be learning about multiplication and division, money, statistics and measurement. In Science the children will be learning about forces and magnets, which will link into our Forest School sessions too.

#### **Home Learning**

You will receive a new Home Learning brochure with tasks linked to our topic until half term. Homework tasks for both topic and Maths will continue to be set on **Thursdays**. Please hand in homework by **Tuesday** to allow time for us to mark and return it. Please complete Maths homework using a pencil rather than pen as it looks so much neater.

#### **Spellings**

The spellings for this half term are: prefixes mis and re, the I sound spelt y (as in gym) and the suffix ly. For Term 4 they are: possessive apostrophes, g sound spelt gue and k sound spelt que, sh sound spelt ch

#### Reading

Well done to all those children who are reading daily: Miss Harrold is often spoilt for choice with our Star Reader board each week. We now have many more free readers, which is fantastic. Keep it up!

### **Cracking Times Tables**

We're thrilled that nearly a third of the class is working on Level 10 or above! A huge well done to Timon who is now on Level 13! We have been so impressed with the determination shown by the children who are keen to pass each week — well done. Do encourage the use of **Times Tables Rock Stars** or any other games or quick recall questions to practise multiplication and division facts with your child.

Below is the Cracking Times Tables pyramid for your reference. As you can see, half the class is now working on or above Level 8, which is really impressive. These strong number skills have really helped children when multiplying and dividing. Children in Year 3 need to know the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 & 10 times tables and division facts.
