
Spelling rule 10

Word endings that sound like 'shun'

This week, children are focusing on word endings that sound like 'shun' but are spelled 'sion', 'tion' or 'cian'. These are super important to practise as they are often the words children spell incorrectly. Some strategies you can try at home are:

- Use cut out or magnetic letters to build words together, then mix up the letters and rebuild the word together
- Use mnemonics silly sentences where the first letter of each word makes up the word to be spelled
- Find smaller words in the bigger word, for example 'there is a hen in when'
