2* o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.

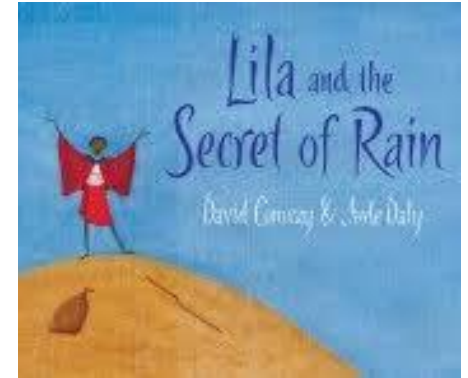
3* 5 minute intervals

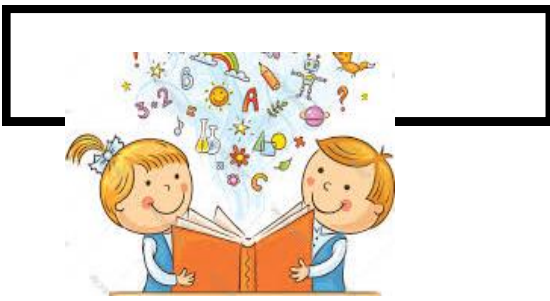

Week 1: set 26th March

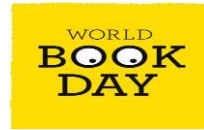
Task: In geography we will be looking at maps. Make a journey stick about a journey you are going on in your local area. This can be as simple as walking to the school or park.

1* - Complete a journey stick and draw what you saw on your journey in your home learning book.

2* - Design some symbols to represent features of your walk.

3* - Explain why that feature is placed there.

WOW - look at a compass and find out about North, South, East and West!



Week 2: set 4th March

Task: It is World Book Day tomorrow and we will be celebrating at school with a poetry themed day. We would like to know all about your favourite book, it doesn't have to be the poem you brought to school.

1* - Write a simple book review telling me about the book and why you liked it.

2* - 1* plus who would you recommend the book to and why.

3* - Write a detailed book review, include the book title, author, what the book is about, who you would recommend the book to and why and finally why it is your favourite book.

WOW - Make a bookmark with your name on it and a reason why you like the book so we can use it to recommend books in school.

Week 3: set 11th March

Task: In maths we will be looking at money, it is really important for children to have a good understanding of money.

1* identify the different coins we have in this country.

2* 1* plus how many different ways can you make 10p using the coins we have in this country.

3* 2* plus how much change would you get from 50p with different amounts. E.g. 12p cake would give you 38p change from 50p.

Wow: See if you can visit a shop and buy something, working out how much money you would need using coins.

Week 4: set 18th March



Task: For Mother's Day draw a family portrait.

1* Draw your family portrait and label it,

2* Choose your own way to create your portrait - perhaps paint, collage, pastels or even model!

3* write about what you love about your family and mum.

WOW - write a poem about your family.
