Class 2

Class 2 have settled in so quickly and show such great learning behaviour that Miss Redman keeps calling them 'Class 3'! The children have been thinking about how they are both similar and different from each other. They have created silhouettes of themselves which contain pictures of things that are important to them. In Maths, we have started our Cracking Times Tables challenge and four children achieved Level 1 on their first attempt - impressive! We have used our map skills to name the continents and oceans of the world and had fun locating Ashton Keynes and Bangladesh (our contrasting location) using Google Earth. We have looked at lots of pictures of Bangladesh and thought about how it is similar and different to where we live.

Class 3

We are really impressed with how well the children have settled into Year 3. As part of our whole school project, we've been finding similarities and differences about our lives and those around the world. The children have reflected thoughtfully on this and we have been really proud of how they have shown empathy. Some of the books we have enjoyed sharing are Malala's Magic Pencil, God's Very Good Idea and Under the same sky. In our Forest School session this week, the children enjoyed planting onion and garlic bulbs — we can't wait to watch these grow over the coming months! We are also going to be learning about looking after plants in Science this term. What a fantastic start to the year Class 3!

Breakfast Club

If you attend our breakfast club, please ensure you have made your bookings by Thursday midnight as the register for Monday morning will be printed on a Friday. You can call the school office on Friday if you need an emergency booking or the breakfast club mobile and cash can be paid in a named envelope. Otherwise we are now a cashless service (payment on Parentpay). The numbers for breakfast club have really fallen since we have returned and I am sure this is due to the change in situation but we do need to secure numbers to keep this wonderful resource running. Breakfast club operates from 8am (£3) each morning and includes breakfast or you can choose the stay and play sessions at 8:30 am (£1.50) breakfast not included. It is run by our school staff. Any new enquiries can be made via the school office. We have all COVID 19 risk assessment and procedures in place for this before school provision.

After school club

Mighty oak operates daily until 6pm in our school and I am delighted to inform you that they are back better than ever as they now have a new home (in our refurbed reception mobile) which is fabulously decorated and set up by the team for your children. It has a large space indoors and outdoors for your children including a table tennis facility outdoors. Enquiries should be made through mighty oaks but on return to school their numbers are lower than usual so really do need support. They are all COVID risk assessment compliant and set up.

AK 24 Hour Run for the Learning Hub

From 4pm on Friday the 25th September 12 parents (including the Paris 6) will be running a 24-hour relay around the village to raise money for the Learning Hub.
