

My reflection on the classes at the end of term 1:

Parents you should all be so proud of your children. I certainly feel proud of them and I am so thankful for the chance to have our school family back in school, the build finished and am so grateful to all of my wonderful staff team who are so passionate and happy and give everything to your children every day. Class R- what a wonderful start- coming in so beautifully in the mornings and gelling so well as a class- the staff team have been super happy with them all. It has been a real highlight seeing them learning together indoors and outside at play and growing in confidence every single day. I know all of their names now and adore watching them learn and grow. A moment which really made me smile (and there have been so many already) was this week in forest school when one group were planting bulbs with Mrs Serle, another was on a nature exploration around the school grounds with Mr Jackson and Miss Noonan took a group for outdoor play and watching them carousel around these three outdoor activities, asking questions, smiling and engaging with learning outdoors was just wonderful.

Class 1- WOW- you would just be so impressed to see how well Class 1 have adjusted to life as a Year 1. You would never know that they have missed one third of their reception year as they have been so happy to return to our beautiful new classroom and learning hub and have settled beautifully. Miss Igoe and the team tell me daily how proud they are of your children. They make me so happy that I have to do star jumps at the window and door with excitement!

Class 2- Where do I start. Every single day Miss Redman has something wonderful to tell me about Class 2! I have seen beautiful learning and I am super impressed with how they have entered Year 2 and adjusted to the expectations so well considering they missed lots of Year 1. I have loved hearing them perform poetry singing and last week the I loved seeing the beautiful nature inspired art work the class were doing. Their leaf sketching and pastelling made so much progress through the week and the result was stunning!

Class 3- A wonderful start to the juniors for Class 3. Already the class feels very ready to take up the junior responsibility and are very settled and happy. I have seen some beautiful learning from class 3 both indoors and out and they are always super keen to share their learning with me. I would say it is their handwriting and presentation improvement which is really wowing me at the moment and their absolute commitment to daily reading. Well done Class 3- thank you for being so thoughtful, hardworking and enthusiastic.

Class 4-What an amazing start back for class 4. They have embraced the year fully and have impressed the socks off the Deputy Head Mr Hockaday who is their new teacher. The class are so incredibly engaged and for me I can see the greatest growth in their responsibility. On all levels, the class are doing jobs, taking on leadership roles, taking a real responsibility for themselves and their learning and I am delighted with them. Their handwriting has massively improved and it gives me goose bumps to see their beautiful writing and the pride they have for presentation. They are also loving the outdoors and will be the first class to trial our outdoor welly peg system to try and keep our children outdoors more in all weathers.

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Class 5- On every level the class are shining. They always embrace new challenges and give things a go. They are super keen to give their best and I am particularly proud of how they explain themselves, listen to one another and politely agree/ disagree giving clear reasons. I wish I was able to do this at their age- this will set them up brilliantly for the future. Thank you Class 5!

Class 6- What a wonderful year 6 class. I always say, your school is only as good as the behaviour of your Year 6 pupils. They really are role models and lead the way. They are polite, strong, resilient and ever so keen to learn. Even when faced with a challenge they work hard through this and persevere. I am always massively impressed as I pop by, everyone is so engaged and maximising their time in school. They are almost qualified in level 1 fencing (the sport not the garden fence qualification) and have had a term of art specialist teaching to develop the most incredible sculptures. I am super proud of Year 6.

The absolute commitment and passion, love of teaching, learning and making a difference, the very high expectations at every level along with the love for our school family all working together to produce this wonderful, happy incredibly special school which we have.





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












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












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Ted our school dog-
