Dear Parents and Carers,

Safety at school drop off and pick up - Ellisons'Bus area and parking

Morning drop off, once your child/ren are at the gates and directed into school by the teacher, please could you move swiftly away from the entrance. There is a bottle neck at the main entrance and this would help us enormously and ensure a swift flow of children into school via the main gates. We will be slightly staggering Reception start to 8.55am to ensure a calm experience for our youngest pupils as they experience school for the first time as a whole class. On collection, the Class R team will open the gates at 3.00pm for Class R parents and carers only to collect their children. The gates will then be relocked until 3.15pm for general collection of pupils from the rest of the school. Thank you so much.

Secondly, I totally understand parking is a challenge in the village but for yours and your children's safety please could I politely remind parents not to park in/ directly opposite the entrance to Ellisons' garage (next to the village shop). There are often large coaches coming in/out of there and parking in the entrance/ directly opposite/very near, blocks visibility and could cause an incident. There are usually spaces further down/ round the back by the village hall or in roads close by and these are much safer. Thank you for your cooperation.

Attendance

I will be sending out another separate update on COVID 19 shortly for clarity. Attendance in school is so important, any missed time will result in missed learning and could result in a shortfall in expected progress. Whilst we know COVID 19 is still very much here, we cannot afford for children to be off school where not COVID related or really unwell.

In terms of reporting any child absent from school in term time for any reason, please DO NOT EMAIL but telephone the school on 01285 861436. There is an answerphone for before school hours and when the office is manned you can speak to a member of the office team. We have to respond quickly to our registers if a child is not in school and we do not have time to trawl through many emails to find this information. My office team will call you if they do not hear from you, for safeguarding reasons.

We are entering the season of colds again. Your child can be in school with a cold but if unsure please do not hesitate to do a PCR test. I do not want parents to feel uncomfortable sending in a child with hayfever/ a cold. However, please do not send them in with a temperature, persistent cough, and/or a loss of taste and smell, and in the event of doing a test, please ensure that you do a PCR test not a lateral flow.

If you do PCR tests, please use the drive through centres (Agricultural College in Cirencester and in various sites in Swindon are close by) as they are quick and postal ones take longer. We need your children to not miss school unless they absolutely have to (eg isolation due to a postive COVID test, Sickness and Diarrhoea, or generally feeling really unwell). Thank you for supporting us with this.

AKPS Shine Party

We have been working our socks off ready for the Shine Party- Saturday 25th September, (2-8.30pm) to celebrate 150 years of AK school and officially open the new build- this is a very special one off event! I so hope you can join us! The event is largely outdoors with guided tours of the hub. There will be many refreshments to purchase, entertainment and much musical entertainment from the community. We have the Bishop of Swindon coming to bless our new learning hub at 3pm-3.30pm for the official opening. We have an exciting samba workshop for every class on Thursday 23rd September in preparation for the shine party and a procession of a few children from this will lead everyone in for the start of the part at 2pm. During the day of the party, children across the school will be involved in many ways including: samba procession, class entertainment stalls, glitter star tattoos, serving in the tea tent, being a Shine Marshall, being a Hub Tour Guide, singing in the choir, playing instruments. They will all be clear about what they are doing and you will receive letters/ slips informing you. Staff and parent and community volunteers will also be on rota during the day ensuring that everyone can help but also enjoy the day fully. I am very much looking forward to the day. Fingers crossed for some good weather! As you've been reminded before, for safety reasons, there will be no parking in Gosditch or around the school so please park in the village and walk down and come dressed for all weather and maybe bring a foldable chair for your comfort.


