Muslims show great commitment by committing to the five pillars of Islam. These are reasonably difficult to follow sometimes yet are expected to be carried out by all Muslims over the age of twelve with some exceptions.

I think that when you die, you are reborn. But when we are reborn, we are similar to our previous life, for example: if you were like me - brave, strong, determined and fierce - you would have those characteristics in your next life.
