- We create a carefully planned inside and outside learning environment where children are given opportunities to use/embed what they have learnt through our evolving continuous provision.

- We provide hands on learning opportunities(Shine experiences) enabling children to be inspired and motivated.
- Our star challenge approach enables children to challenge themselves and develop resilience.
