Year R

Year 2


Class 2 have had a busy summer term

The children enjoyed a special theatre performance from the Trunk Theatre which really brought the story to life and was a great way to start their learning. They are all incredibly knowledgeable about the events and have produced some excellent work showing how well they have understood why the fire spread so quickly. Here is an example:



The children shared what they had learnt with their parents in their class assembly. They performed poetry, sang songs about the Great Fire and ended with some beautiful recorder playing. We were incredibly proud of how well they delivered their lines and performed with such confidence showing how ready they are for key stage 2.

The children produced some fantastic art with Mrs Dyminski. They used art foam to create animals inspired by the picture book *The Lion Inside* by Rachel Bright and produced stunning prints. They also used their colour mixing skills to create beautiful colour wheels using watercolour paints.
